NCGS 50-90 through 50-100 authorizes the appointment of Parenting Coordinators in Domestic Child Custody Actions.

Parenting Coordination is a court appointed and child focused process that assists divorcing parents in resolving issues of custody and visitation or implementing a court order. The Parenting Coordinator acts as a facilitator and impartial decision maker on behalf of the children when disputes pertaining to implementation of the court order arise.

In addition to this training, to qualify as a Parenting Coordinator participants must: hold a masters or doctorate degree in psychol-
